- foregoing provisions of this section, the Governor-General shall forthwith refer the petition to the Chief Elections Officer for verification of the signatures of the petitioners, and for certification that at least ten percent of the registered electors in the entire country, (or if the referendum is to be held in any specified district or area of Belize, twenty- five percent of the registered electors in that district or area) have in fact appended their signatures to the petition.

(4) On receipt of the petition from the Governor-General, the Chief Elections Officer shall proceed with due expedition to verify the signatures on the petition and return the petition to the Governor-General as soon as

- practicable but not later than two months from the date of receipt of the petition, with certificate as to whether or not the petition had been duly signed by the requisite number of electors as specified in sub-section (3) of this section. (5) Any person who forges a signature on the petition aforesaid, or who signs the petition more that once, is guilty of an offence and shall
- be liable to summary conviction to a fine not exceeding one thousand dollars, or to imprisonment for a term not exceeding one year, or to both such fine and imprisonment.
- **3.**—(1) The Governor-General shall, within thirty days,
