leave of absence may have in respect of such salary and allowance.

Pensions

7.–(1) Every person, who, having been appointed Governor-General on or after the 21st September, 1981, ceases at any time after such appointment to be Governor-General, shall be paid a pension under this

Act with effect from the date on which he ceases to be Governor-General

(2) Governor-General's pension shall, if the person to whom it is

payable is appointed Prime Minister or is again appointed Governor-General, cease to be payable during the period in respect of which that person holds the office of Prime Minister or again holds the office of Governor-General.

8.–(1) Subject to subsection (3), of this section, the rate of the Governor-General's pension payable under this Act is two-thirds of the highest rate of salary paid to that person at any time as Governor-General.

(3) Where a person to whom Governor-General's pension is payable is in receipt of a pension payable under any Act for the time being in force in Belize, only so much of the Governor-General's pension shall be paid to him or her as will, when added to his or her other pension, amount to two-thirds of the highest annual rate of salary paid to him or her at any time as Governor-General.

9.-(1) A person who is entitled to a Governor-General's pension may at his option exercisable in accordance with subsection (2) of this section be paid in lieu thereof a pension at the rate of three-fourths of such pension together with a gratuity equal to twelve and one-half times the amount of the reduction so made in the pension.

(2) The option referred to in subsection (1) of this section is exercisable by notice in writing addressed to the Minister within thirty days of the date on which the person concerned ceases to be Governor-General or within such further period as the Minister may allow.
