- conditions as the authorised officer may impose. **5.** If the authorised officer does not reply to the applicant within ten days of the receipt by him of the application mentioned in section 3 of this
- Act, subject to the provisions of any applicable fire protection plan under section 4 of the Forest Fire Protection Act, Cap. 212 and of any special area precautionary plan under section 21 of the Disaster Preparedness and Response Act, Cap. 145, such applicant shall be at liberty to set fire
- **6.** Any person aggrieved by the refusal of the authorised officer to grant a licence may appeal to the Minister.
