HIGH SEAS FISHING

PART I

Preliminary

- 1. This Act may be cited as the High Seas Fishing Act.
- **2.** In this Act, unless the context otherwise requires,

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Short title.

Interpretation.

"fishing vessel" means any vessel used or intended for use on the high seas for the purposes of the commercial exploitation of fish, including mother ships and any other vessels directly engaged in fishing operations;

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"foreign fishing vessel" means a fishing vessel other than a fishing vessel of Belize:

"high seas" means the marine waters beyond the territorial sea, archipelagic waters, fisheries zone or exclusive economic zone of any

"High Seas Fishing Licence" means a fishing licence issued pursuant to section 7 of this Act:

"IMMARBE" means the International Merchant Marine Registry of Belize:

"international conservation and management measures" means measures to conserve or manage one or more species of living marine resources that are adopted and applied in accordance with the relevant rules of international law reflected in the 1982 United Nations Convention of the Law of the Sea either by global, regional or sub-regional fisheries organizations subject to the rights and obligations of their members, or by treaties or other international agreements;

"length" means for any fishing vessel,

(a) built after 18 July 1982, ninety-six *per cent* of the total length on a waterline at eighty-five *per cent* of the least moulded depth measured from the top of the keel, or the length from the fore side of the stem to the axis of the rudderstock on that waterline; if that be greater. In vessels designed with a rake of keel the waterline on which this length is measured shall be parallel to the designed waterline;

- (3) For the purposes of this section "fishing vessel" includes all equipment on board or equipment used by the vessel and also includes any fish which has been detained on board the vessel under this Act.
- **14.** In accordance with the provisions of the Registration of Merchant Ships (Disciplinary) Regulations, 1999, and in particular, regulations 5, 6, 7 and 8 of those regulations, the Director-General and Senior Deputy
- Registrar of IMMARBE, after examining the facts relating to a violation or offence, may issue a written warning, impose a fine or order the cancellation of registration or documents.
