- 2. In this Act, unless the context otherwise requires,
- "Board" means the Belize Tourism Board established in accordance with this Act;

Establishment and 3.-(1) There is hereby established for the purposes of this Act a body to composition be called the Belize Tourism Board. Board.

(2) The Board shall consist of no fewer than five nor more than eight members appointed by the Minister. Of the members, one shall be the Chief Executive Officer to the Ministry for the time being responsible for Tourism, and three shall be appointed from amongst persons who have

- (2) The Chairperson or Deputy Chairperson of the Board shall hold office as such until the appointment or election of his successor but he shall cease to be Chairperson or Deputy Chairperson, as the case may be, if he ceases to be a member of the Board.
  - (3) A retiring Chairperson or Deputy Chairperson shall be eligible for
- reappointment or re-election, as the case may be.
- 5.–(1) A member of the Board other than an ex officio member shall, subject to subsections (2) and (3) of this section, hold office for such period, not exceeding three years, as the Minister may direct in the instrument appointing such member, but such member shall be eligible for reappointment.

- (2) Any member of the Board other than an *ex officio* member may at any time resign his office by instrument in writing addressed to the Chairperson, who shall forthwith cause it to be forwarded to the Minister, and upon the date of the receipt by the Chairperson of such instrument such member shall cease to be a member of the Board.
- (3) The Minister may at any time for good and sufficient cause revoke the appointment of a member of the Board other than an *ex officio* member if he thinks it expedient so to do.
- **6.** The appointment, removal, death or resignation of any member of the Board, other than an *ex officio* member, shall be published in the *Gazette*.

- (5) Subject to this Act, the decisions of the Board shall be by a majority of votes and, in addition to an original vote, in any case in which the voting is equal, the Chairperson or Deputy Chairperson presiding at the meeting shall have a casting vote.
- (6) Minutes in proper form of each meeting shall be kept by such officer as the Board may appoint and shall be confirmed by the Board at the next meeting and signed by the Chairperson or the Deputy Chairperson, as the case may be.
- (7) The Board may co-opt any one or more persons to attend any particular meeting of the Board for the purpose of assisting or advising the Board, but no such co-opted persons shall have any right to vote.
- (8) Subject to this Act, the Board shall have power to regulate its own proceedings.
- **10.**–(1) The Board may appoint a committee of the Board to examine and report on any matter whatsoever arising out of or connected with any of its powers and duties under this Act.

Duties and functions of Board.

- (2) Any such committee shall consist of at least two members of the Board together with such other persons whether members of the Board or not, whose assistance or advice the Board may desire.
- (3) Where persons, not being members of the Board, are members of a committee appointed under this section, or where any person is coopted under section 9 (7) of this Act, the Board may by resolution declare the remuneration and allowances of such persons, and such sums shall properly be payable out of the funds and resources of the Board.
- (4) The Board may by resolution reject the report of any such committee or adopt it either wholly or with such modifications, additions
- or adaptations as the Board may think fit.
