Short title. **2.** In this Act, unless the context otherwise requires, Interpretation. 21 of 1982. "Council" means the Medical Council of Belize established under section 3 of the Medical Practitioners Registration Act, Cap. 318; 15 of 2004. "Council for Human and Social Development" means the organ of the CARICOM Community empowered by Article 35 of the Treaty of Chaguaramas establishing the Caribbean Community including the CARICOM Single Market and Economy in establishing common standards and measures for accreditation or mutual recognition of diplomas, certification and other evidence of qualification of nationals of CARICOM Member States. "optometry" or "the practice of optometry" means the employment of any methods for the estimation of errors of refraction of the human eye, and the prescribing or adapting of lenses to correct such errors; "Register" means the "Opticians' Register" kept under section 4 of this Act; "Registrar" means the Registrar General. 3. The office of the Registrar General shall be the registry of qualified Registry and Registrar. opticians and the Registrar General shall be the Registrar under this Act. Keeping and publication of Regis-

ter. 8 of 1978.

4.–(1) The Registrar shall keep, as nearly as may be in accordance with the form in the First Schedule, an "Opticians' Register" in which he shall enter the names of all persons entitled to be registered as optometry practitioners under this Act, and he shall give to each person at the time of registration a certificate in the form of the Second Schedule for which the stamp duty prescribed by the Stamp

Duties Act, Cap. 64 shall be paid. (2) The Registrar in the month of January in each year shall

publish in the Gazette a copy of the said register.

- (3) Any copy of the *Gazette* containing the most recent copy of the Register shall be sufficient evidence in all legal proceedings, unless the contrary is shown, that the persons therein specified are registered under this Act, and the absence of the name of any person from such copy shall be sufficient evidence, unless the contrary is shown, that such person is not registered under this Act.
- (4) In the case of a person whose name does not appear in the copy of the *Gazette*, a certified copy under the hand of the Registrar of the entry of the name of such person in the Register shall be evidence that such person is registered under this Act.

- **6.**–(1) No person, unless duly registered under this Act, shall practice optometry in Belize either for or without reward nor carry on business under any title, name or description implying that he is registered under this Act.
- (2) The use of test lenses, spectacles, trial frames, an ophthalmoscope, a retinoscope or any apparatus that may be used to measure refraction or visual acuity, or muscular equilibrium, shall be deemed conclusive evidence of the practice of optometry.

- (6) Where the judge thinks that the applicant is of a good moral character and is entitled to be registered under this Act, a direction to that effect shall be issued to the Registrar and the order of the court shall be final and conclusive and not subject to an appeal to any other court.
- 9.—(1) The Registrar shall erase from the Register any entry which has been incorrectly or fraudulently made, and shall erase the name of any person who dies, or who has given notice that he has ceased

to practice, or who has been continually absent from Belize for a

10.—(1) Where any person registered under this Act after due inquiry is judged by a majority of the Council to have been guilty of any

infamous or disgraceful conduct in any professional respect, the Council may, if it sees fit, direct the Registrar to erase the name of

such person from the Register.

12. Any person who knowingly fraudulently makes, or causes or permits to be made, any false or incorrect entry in the Register, or any copy thereof, commits an offence and is liable on conviction on indictment to imprisonment for a term not exceeding two years.

13.–(1) Nothing in the Act shall extend to prejudice or in any way affect any registered medical practitioner.

- (2) Nothing in this Act shall so operate as to prohibit,
 - (a)
 - any registered chemist or druggist from dispensing, selling or supplying any drugs or applying them to secure local anaesthesia for the purpose of removing any foreign body from the eye;
 - *(b)* any wholesale dealer from supplying frames, ophthalmic lenses or spectacles in the ordinary course of wholesale business; or
 - (c) any person from selling in a permanent place of business, and otherwise then in compliance with a prescription given by a registered medical practitioner, or a registered optician, spectacles kept in stock in a state ready for use.
