1. This Act may be cited as the Iglesia Evangelica Pentecostes Del

Redentor Act.

Short title.

Interpretation. 2. In this Act, unless the context otherwise requires,

"Church" or "Corporation" means the Iglesia Evangelica Pentecostes del Redentor constituted under section 3 of this Act;

"property" means property of every description, real or personal, movable or immovable.

3.-(1) The Iglesia Pentecostes del Redentor is hereby constituted a body Constitution of the Church as a body corporate with perpetual succession and a common seal which may from corporate. time to time be altered, and it may by its corporate name sue or be sued,
