Preliminary

1. This Act may be cited as the Belize National Aids Commission Act.

12.–(1) The Commission shall appoint and employ, at such remuneration and subject to such terms and conditions as it thinks fit, a suitably qualified Executive Director.

- (2) The Executive Director shall report to the Commission and shall, subject to the directions of the Commission, be responsible for the day-to-day operation and management of the affairs of the Commission.
- (3) The Commission may appoint and employ, at such remuneration and subject to such terms and conditions as it thinks fit, such other officers and employees of the Commission as may be necessary for the proper performance of the functions and the attainment of the objectives of the Commission.
- (4) The person who, immediately before the commencement of this Act, was the Director of the Commission shall continue as Executive Director as if appointed under subsection (1) of this section.
