ALIENS (REGISTRATION)

CAP. 125, R.E., 1980-1990. [14th December, 1968] 25 of 1968. 14 of 1982. 15 of 1986. 22 of 1987. 42 of 1999. 15 of 2004. **1.** This Act may be cited as the Aliens (Registration) Act. Interpretation. 2. In this Act, unless the context otherwise requires,

15 of 2004. "alien" means a person who is not,

- a citizen of Belize; (a)
- (b) a national of a CARICOM Member State; or
- *(c)* a Commonwealth citizen.

"keeper" where used in relation to premises where accommodation is provided for reward, includes any person who for reward receives any other person to stay in the premises, whether on his own behalf or as manager or otherwise on behalf of any other person;

"Minister" means the Minister responsible for Home Affairs;

"registration officer" includes the Chief Registration Officer and the deputy chief registration officer;

"residence" means ordinary dwelling place;

"stay" means lodge or sleep for one night or more in accommodation provided for reward.

3.–(1) The Director of Immigration and Nationality Services shall be the Chief Registration Officer for the purposes of this Act.

(2) The Senior Immigration Officer shall be the deputy chief registration officer and such officer shall, subject to the directions of the Director of Immigration and Nationality Services, have and may exercise all the powers, functions and duties vested in the Director of Immigration and Nationality Services under this Act.

(3) Immigration officers shall be registration officers for all or any specified part of Belize for the purpose of carrying out the provisions of this Act.

(4) Any police officer may if authorised by the Director of Immigration and Nationality Services and subject to his directions, act as a registration officer.

(5) Every registration officer shall have in the exercise of his duties all the powers of a police officer.

4.-(1) Subject to section 5 of this Act, every person who,

- (a) being an alien of or over the age of sixteen years enters Belize on any occasion;
- (b) being an alien within Belize attains the age of sixteen years;
- (c) being of or over the age of sixteen years becomes an alien while in Belize,

shall within thirty days comply with the provisions of subsection (2) of this section.

(2) Every alien as mentioned in subsection (1) of this section, shall attend at the office of a registration officer (in the case of an alien who has a residence in Belize the registration officer of the judicial district in

Change of residence.

7.–(1) Where any alien registered under this Act proposes to change his place of residence, he shall,

- (a) inform the registration officer of the district in which he has his residence of his intention to change the place of his residence;
- (b) state the date of the proposed change; and
- (c) state the address at which he proposes to reside after the change.

(2) Where such an alien changes his place of residence he shall, within seven days after such change, report the change and produce his certificate of registration as an alien, at the office of the registration officer of the district in which he has his place of residence, and if required to do so by the registration officer, he shall report in person to the registration officer.

8.–(1) Every alien to whom a certificate of registration has been issued under this Act shall, within forty-eight hours of any request to do so, produce his certificate to any registration officer or to any member of the Police Department.

(2) No person to whom a certificate of registration has been issued shall end, transfer, assign or part with the possession of such certificate to any other person.

(3) Where a person has in his possession a certificate of registration, he shall answer all questions put to him by a registration officer or a member of the Police Department for the purpose of establishing his identity with the person named in the certificate, and shall, if required by a registration officer or member of the police department to do so, submit to his fingerprints being taken for that purpose.

registers, 9.-(1) The keeper of any premises to which this section applies shall,

- (a) keep a register in such form as may be prescribed relating to all persons (whether aliens or not) of or over the age of sixteen years staying at all premises and shall require all such persons to comply with their obligations under subsection (2) of this section;
- (b) furnish every month to the registration officer of the district in which such premises are situate in such form as may be prescribed a return of aliens staying in the premises at the time of such return or who have stayed in such premises since the last return was made.

(2) Every person of or over the age of sixteen years who stays at any premises to which this section applies shall,

- (a) in every case, on arriving at the premises, enter or cause to be entered in the register his name, nationality and date of arrival;
- (b) in the case of an alien, furnish to the keeper of the premises a signed statement in the form set out in the Second Schedule and, on departure, complete such statement.

(3) Every register kept or statement furnished under this section shall be preserved by the keeper of the premises until twelve months from the date when the last entry was made or from the date when the statement was made, as the case may be, and shall at all times be open for inspection by a police officer or registration officer.

(4) This section applies to any premises whether furnished or unfurnished where lodging or sleeping accommodation is provided for reward.

- (b) without lawful authority or excuse, alters any certificate of registration issued under section 6 of this Act;
- (c) without lawful authority or excuse, has in his possession any certificate of registration issued to a person other than himself or any altered certificate of registration issued under section 6 of this Act or any forged certificate of registration purporting to be issued under section 6 of this Act;
- (d) fails to comply with any of the provisions of section 7 of this Act;
- (e) fails to comply with any of the provisions of section 8 or 9 of this Act; or
- (f) assaults, resists, obstructs, hinders or gives false information to any registration officer or member of the police department in the execution of his duty under this Act,

commits an offence and is liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding five hundred dollars or to imprisonment for a term of six months, or to both such fine and term of imprisonment.

11.–(1) The Minister may make regulations,

(a) governing the permits and certificates which may be issued under this Act, the conditions upon which any such permit or certificate shall be issued, the circumstances under which they may be cancelled and the fees which may be charged for any such permit or certificate;

- **3.** Date and country of birth.
- 4. Profession or occupation.
- 5. Date, place and mode of arrival in this country.
- 6. Address of place of residence in this country.
- 7. Address of last place of residence out of this country.
- 8. Particulars of passport or other document establishing nationality and identity.
- **9.** The names in full and sex of any children under the age of 16 years resident with him in this country.

THIRD SCHEDULE

ALIENS (REGISTRATION) ACT Classes of persons exempt from Registration [Section 12 (1)]

1. Persons in the service of the Government or in the service of the State.

2. Consuls general, consuls, vice-consuls or consular officers of a foreign power duly accredited to Belize and the staff of any such persons.

3. The wife and any child who has not attained the age of 16 years of any person referred to in any of the other paragraphs of this Schedule.

4. Students over the age of sixteen years attending any school within the country recognised by the Ministry of Education.
